Top 3 cultural heritage objects in Latvia



1) HISTORICAL CENTER OF RIGA

RÍGA, FOUNDED IN 1201, WAS A MAJOR HANSEATIC CITY FROM THE 13TH TO THE 15TH CENTURIES. NOT MANY HOUSES REMAIN FROM THAT PERIOD, AS THEY WERE DESTROYED BY FIRE OR WAR. LATER, RIGA SAW A RAPID EXPANSION IN THE 19TH AND EARLY 20TH CENTURY, WHEN MANY ART NOUVEAU BUILDINGS WERE CONSTRUCTED. RIGA HAS THE HIGHEST CONCENTRATION OF BUILDINGS IN THIS STYLE IN EUROPE.

2) STRUVE GEODETIC ARC

THE STRUVE GEODETIC ARC IS A SERIES OF TRIANGULATION POINTS, STRETCHING OVER A DISTANCE OF 2,820 KILOMETRES (1,750 MI) FROM HAMMERFEST IN NORWAY TO THE BLACK SEA. THE POINTS WERE SET UP IN A SURVEY BY THE ASTRONOMER FRIEDRICH GEORG WILHELM VON STRUVE WHO FIRST CARRIED OUT AN ACCURATE MEASUREMENT OF A LONG SEGMENT OF A MERIDIAN – AND ALONG WITH IT THE SIZE AND SHAPE OF THE EARTH.

3)KULDIGA

KULDĪGA, ALSO KNOWN HISTORICALLY AS GOLDINGEN, WAS FIRST DOCUMENTED IN 1242. AS AN IMPORTANT TRADE JUNCTION, IT WAS A MEMBER OF THE HANSEATIC LEAGUE. THE HISTORIC CENTRE IS WELL PRESERVED AND DATES TO FROM THE LATE 16TH TO THE 18TH CENTURIES, WHEN THE CITY WAS THE SEAT OF THE DUCHY OF COURLAND AND SEMIGALLIA.

1) Archaeological Areas of Pompei, Herculaneum and Torre Annunziata

In the year 79 AD, the Vesuvius volcano in southern Italy erupted and buried the surrounding area under layers of ash and rock. At the time Pompeii was an urbanized town of 25 000 people just recovering from a recent earthquake. The holiday resort of Herculaneum and the splendid wall paintings of the Villa Oplontis at Torre Annunziata were destroyed as well. The site was discovered in the 16th century and became accessible to the public in the mid-18th century. It provides a complete and vivid insight into one part of Italy's past which is without parallel anywhere in the world.

2) City of Verona

The historic city of Verona was founded back in the 1st century BC, but it was not until the rule of the Scaliger family in the 13th and 14th centuries that it prospered. The city core consists of the Roman town in the loop of the river, around which the Scaligers rebuilt the walls. Verona has preserved a big number of monuments from antiquity, the medieval and Renaissance periods and stands for a remarkable example of a military stronghold. It is without doubt one of the richest cities when it comes to Roman remains.

3) Amalfi Coast

The Amalfi Coast is an area of breathtaking natural beauty and diversity. It has been a popular settlement since the early Middle Ages and cities like Amalfi and Ravello with their artistic and architectural works have become places of great importance. The rural areas of the coast show the versatility of the inhabitants which have adapted their use of the land to the diverse nature of the terrain, from vineyards and orchards on the lower parts to wide upland pastures. The Coast itself seems to be one grand balcony suspended between a crystal blue sea and the feet of the Lattari Mountains.

Top 3 cultural heritage objects in Spain





1) ALHAMBRA, GRANADA

ALONG WITH ALBAICÍN AND GENERALIFE GARDENS, IT HAS BEEN A WORLD HERITAGE SITE SINCE 1984. ALHAMBRA WAS THE RESIDENCE OF THE MOORISH MONARCHS WHO USED TO RULE THIS PART OF SPAIN. ALHAMBRA FORTRESS IS NOTABLE FOR BEING AN EXCEPTIONAL EXAMPLE OF THE MOORISH INFLUENCE ON THIS COUNTRY, ONE OF THE BEST-PRESERVED IN THE WHOLE WORLD!

2) GAUDÍ'S WORKS, BARCELONA

SEVEN WONDERS HAVE BEEN DISTINGUISHED AS WORLD HERITAGE SITES, ALL WORK FROM THE SAME MAN, ANTONI GAUDÍ. IT'S NO SURPRISE TO ANYONE THAT ONE OF THE WORLD'S MOST FAMOUS ARCHITECTS GOT ALL THESE TITLES. ITS WORKS BECOME TRUE SYMBOLS OF THE MODERNIST MOVEMENT AND BARCELONA WOULD NOT BE THE SAME WITHOUT THESE CHARACTERISTIC ARCHITECTURAL FEATURES. THE BUILDINGS LISTED ARE PARQUE GUELL, SAGRADA FAMILIA, CASA MILA, CASA BATLLÓ, CRYPT IN COLONIA GUELL, PALACIO GUELL AND CASA VICENS.

3) DOÑANA NATIONAL PARK, HUELVA

KNOW AS ONE OF THE MOST IMPORTANT NATURAL PROTECTED AREAS IN EUROPE, DOÑANA NATIONAL PARK IS A KEY POINT FOR MIGRATORY BIRD ROUTES BETWEEN AFRICA AND EUROPE. ALTHOUGH MOST OF THE FAUNA HERE ARE BIRDS, DOÑANA EXHIBITS A WIDE VARIETY OF WILDLIFE, INCLUDING ENDANGERED SPECIES LIKE THE IBERIAN LYNX.





Top 3 cultural heritage objects in CR



1) THE HISTORIC CENTRE OF PRAGUE

PRAGUE CONTAINS MANY OUTSTANDING EXAMPLES OF GOTHIC, HIGH BAROQUE AND MODERNIST ARCHITECTURE. IN THE YEARS FOLLOWING 1900, THE CITY STRONGLY INFLUENCED THE DEVELOPMENT OF CENTRAL EUROPEAN ARCHITECTURE.

BECAUSE THE HISTORICAL CENTRE OF PRAGUE HAS BEEN LUCKY ENOUGH TO AVOID LARGE-SCALE DEMOLITION AND URBANIZATION, IT REMAINS REMARKABLY FAITHFUL TO ITS MEDIEVAL ROOTS WITH REGARDS TO ITS LAYOUT.

THROUGHOUT HISTORY, PRAGUE HAS BEEN ASSOCIATED WITH SOME OF THE MOST SIGNIFICANT NAMES IN ART, SCIENCE AND POLITICS. CHARLES UNIVERSITY (FOUNDED IN 1348) IS ONE OF THE OLDEST AND MOST DISTINGUISHED UNIVERSITIES IN EUROPE.

2) CESKY KRUMLOV

STILL RETAINS MUCH OF ITS MEDIEVAL CHARM AND IS SEEN AS A SUPERB EXAMPLE OF WHAT A SMALL TOWN WOULD HAVE BEEN LIKE IN THE MIDDLE AGES. ITS ARCHITECTURE IS A FAITHFUL REPRESENTATION OF ITS DEVELOPMENT THROUGH THE CENTURIES.

MANY OF THE BUILDINGS HERE ARE SUPERB EXAMPLES OF THEIR PERIOD AND OF THEIR PARTICULAR ARCHITECTURAL STYLE. THE TOWN IS HOME TO SOME EXCEPTIONAL DECORATIVE FACADES AND MANY BUILDINGS HAVE MAINTAINED THEIR ORIGINAL LAYOUTS AND INTERIORS.

THE LANDSCAPE OF CESKY KRUMLOV IS DOMINATED BY ITS EXQUISITE CASTLE AND GARDENS. THE CASTLE IS MADE UP OF MANY ELEMENTS AND INCORPORATES FINE EXAMPLES OF BAROQUE, GOTHIC AND RENAISSANCE ARCHITECTURE.

3) THE HISTORIC CENTRE OF KUTNA HORA

THIS INCLUDES THE TOWN'S HISTORIC CENTRE, THE CHURCH OF SAINT BARBARA AND THE CATHEDRAL OF OUR LADY AND ST. JOHN THE BAPTIST AT SEDLEC. KUTNA HORA WAS ORIGINALLY A MINING TOWN. RICH VEINS OF SILVER ORE RUN THROUGH IT, WHICH WERE DISCOVERED IN THE LATE 13TH CENTURY. AS A RESULT, THE TOWN BECAME ENORMOUSLY PROSPEROUS AND HINTS TO THAT LAVISH LUXURY CAN STILL BE SEEN TODAY.




THURSDAY




Hola amigos



Interview about virtual mobility

LAUMA: HAVE YOU EVER TAKEN PART IN A VIRTUAL MOBILITY PROJECT?

MARTA: NO, NEVER. THIS WAS A NEW EXPERIENCE. I HAD NO EXPECTATIONS HOW IT WOULD PLAY OUT. I WAS PLEASANTLY SURPRISED!

LAUMA: HOW DOES IT DIFFER FROM THE NON-VIRTUAL PROGRAM BESIDES THE VIRTUAL PART OF IT ALL?

MARTA: WELL, THE TASKS ARE THE SAME BUT ONLY THE RESTRICTIONS OF COMMUNICATION, LET ME EXPLAIN: YOU CAN ONLY WORK WITH YOUR FELLOW GROUP MATES FROM YOUR COUNTRY INSTEAD OF WORKING ALONG PEOPLE FROM OTHER COUNTRIES.

LAUMA: HOW DO YOU RATE YOUR EXPERIENCE IN THIS VIRTUAL MOBILITY PROJECT? DID YOU LIKE IT?

MARTA: WELL, WHAT CAN I SAY. IT WAS GREAT, EVERYTHING WENT VERY WELL. IF I HAD TO GIVE IT A RATING - 1 OUT OF 10 I WOULD GIVE A SOLID 9/10 BECAUSE IT WOULD'VE BEEN AMAZING IF WE COULD HAVE MET EACH-OTHER IN REAL LIFE.

LAUMA: DID YOU LEARN SOMETHING NEW?

MARTA: OBVIOUSLY I LEARNED SOMETHING NEW!! HOW COULD I NOT?! IN EVERY PROJECT THERE ARE THINGS YOU CAN TAKE WITH YOU IN FURTHER LIFE THAT CAN BE USEFUL. IN THIS PROJECT I DEFINITELY PRACTISED MY COMMUNICATION, FOR AN EXAMPLE MY PRONUNCIATION GOT BETTER, MY PLANNING WAS CHALLENGED (LATER ON IT GOT BETTER) ETC.

LAUMA: HOW WAS IT TO COMMUNICATE WITH A FOREIGNER THROUGH A SCREEN? WAS IT EASY?

MARTA: IT DEFINITELY WAS SOMETHING. I CAN'T SAY IT WAS EASY. SINCE THE PANDEMIC I'VE GROWN USED TO BEING PATIENT WHILE SOMEONE IS HAVING TROUBLE WITH TECHNOLOGY. IN THIS PROJECT MANY PEOPLE HAD MANY TROUBLES. WITH INTERNET, WITH MICROPHONES AND WITH UNDERSTANDING THE TASK - BUT AT THE END OF THE DAY I FELT SATISFIED WITH THE EVENT.

LAUMA: WHAT CAUSED THE MOST TROUBLE IN VIRTUAL MOBILITY DAYS?
